

Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program

Summary: The [Edward Byrne Memorial JAG Program](#), allows states, tribes, and local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime based on their own local needs and conditions. JAG funds may be used for hiring, training, and employing law enforcement officers and support personnel; for overtime pay of personnel; or for any equipment or technology that improves law enforcement functions.

Agency: Ohio Department of Public Safety, Office of Criminal Justice Services

Eligibility: All projects must have an organization that will serve as the fiduciary agent and assume overall responsibility for the grant. Eligible entities include any unit of government such as townships, villages, cities, counties, park districts, and joint recreation districts, along with state agencies and state-supported universities.

Funding: In 2018, it is anticipated that the maximum award amount will be \$20,000.

Cost Match: In 2018, it is anticipated that a 10% cash match will be required for all projects.

Deadline: Applications will open on May 1st, 2018 and close on May 31st, 2018
