

## Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Grant

- Summary:** [The Coronavirus Emergency Supplemental Funding Grant](#) provides funding to entities to ensure effective operations and maintain the safety of criminal justice employees, citizens, and correctional populations in regards to the prevention, preparation, or response to COVID-19.
- Agency:** Ohio Office of Criminal Justice Services (OCJS)
- Eligibility:** This opportunity is open to local governments, state agencies, law enforcement agencies, state-supported universities, and nonprofit or faith-based associations.
- Funding:** There is no ceiling for project funding requests. Projects will be awarded for 6 months or 12 months of funding reimbursements, as far back as March 1, 2020.
- Cost Match:** No cost match is required.
- Deadline:** Applications are accepted on a rolling basis and are to be submitted through the OCJS Grants Management System.

#### Examples of Eligible Activities and Expenses

- Environmental cleaning supplies
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)
- Training and education on COVID-19
- Personnel to maintain operations and staff levels
- Technology for remote supervision and communication
- COVID-19 testing for residential facilities
- Hospital visits and treatments related to COVID-19
- Shelter essentials and alternatives to shelters for victims of violence
- Response planning and policy development
